Theme: "Pharmacovigilance: A step Towards Patient Safety"

National Coordination Centre, Indian Pharmacopoeia Commission announced the official celebration of National Pharmacovigilance week from 17th -23rd September with a theme "Pharmacovigilance: A step Towards Patient Safety" to reach common masses about the importance of reporting Adverse Drug Reactions (ADR)

Inaugural function of NPW was conducted on 18th September 2021 in the auditorium of Sarojini Naidu Vanita Pharmacy Maha Vidyalaya (SNVPMV). This function was organised by inviting Dr B.Surendra, (MD, DM- AIIMS-New Delhi) Medical Oncologist as Chief Guest and Dr B. Prabhashankar, Chairman of Exhibition Society as Guest of Honour. Dr. N Srinivas-Director, Dr T.Sarita Jyostna –Vice Principal and Dr T. Venu, HOD-Pharm D has shared the dais with Dr B. Surendra. Dr N Srinivas in his inaugural address emphasized the importance of ADR monitoring and the role of Pharm D graduates in it. Dr Sarita Jyostna has announced that SNVPMV has enrolled for National Pharmacovigilance Centre and informed the students to make use of the facility to update their skills. Dr T. The virtual conference started with a prayer song by a student of I year B. Pharmacy and a welcome note by Dr. N. Srinivas, Director, SNVPMV. This one-day webinar was hosted by students of IV B.
