CONFERENCE REPORT

The Programme started with Prayer song and followed by a welcome address by **Dr N Srinivas**, Director SNVPMV. In his message he stressed upon the importance of launching of Jan Andolan – Mission; and the challenges and opportunities of clinical pharmacist in eradicating TB by 2025. Dr. V Jyothi, Principal SNVPMV gave a message on the need of such webinars to bring awareness among public regarding this mission and thanked the management for giving an opportunity to organize the conference.

Sri. Ram Prasad Reddy, Secretary, IPA Telangana State Branch, has appreciated the organizers for conducting this event for the welfare of the society in association with IPA-CPD.

First speaker **Prof. Sunitha Chandrasekhar Srinivas**, Visiting Professor, Rhodes University, South Africa: Special Interest Group Member, IPA-CPD, has delivered talk on "Tuberculosis: A Primer". She insisted the need for team work in controlling the TB infection and associated comorbidities. She gave a wakeup call to correct our way of living style.

Raj Vaidya, Co-Lead Antimicrobial Stewardship Initiative, IPA-CPD. He described the activities of national institutes like CTD, NRL, STDC, IRL, SDS, DTC, TB detection centres, state TB cells, drug resistant TB centre and community volunteers in this mission. An inspiring message was accorded by Honourable **Dr. B. Prabha Shankar**, Chairman, SNVPMV; Managing Director, Leads Pharma Pvt. Ltd; and President, Indian Pharmaceutical Association, Telangana State Branch. He narrated the activities of IPA-CPD, IPA Telangana Branch, and PSPP in healthcare. He insisted the pharmacists to take active participation, render their services to make this mission a success and become a part of healthy India.

The Final talk was offered by **Dr. Gautam S Kalyatanda**, Infectious Disease Specialist, Assistant Professor, University of Florida, Gainesville, USA, on the topic, "Eradication of TB by 2025". He explained the ways to combat tuberculosis.

A Vote of Thanks was offered by **Dr. T. Saritha Jyostna**, Vice Principal SNVPMV. She thanked all the participants and staff members who have coordinated to make this conference a great success.

There were 330 students from B. Pharm, M. Pharm and Pharm D courses participated as delegates. The entire day we have conducted this event in SNVPMV and the students who participated in this event gained knowledge about different

aspects of eradiation of TB, particularly the role of pharmacist in preventing and

eradicating the disease. The responses from the students were overwhelming. The

participants expressed that they benefited a lot not only learning the basic concepts

but also the advancements in the patho-mechanisms of Tuberculosis and its

management.



Students actively participated in the interactive session and gave novel ideas on "Awareness on COVID-19" through a skit program.


Dr K. Shanta Kumari, HoD of Pharmaceutical Analysis has announced the winners for various events that are mentioned above.




