1. Introduction

The Pharmacy Council of India (PCI), New Delhi, in collaboration with St. Pauls College of Pharmacy, Turkeyamjal, Telangana, organized a One-Day Faculty Development Program (FDP) on “Effective Implementation of the B. Pharm Syllabus (2026) as per NEP 2020” on 29th August 2026 at the college’s Seminar Hall. The program was conducted as a quality initiative of the PCI and brought together academicians, PCI Central Council Members, industry experts and pharmacy faculty from across the region.

The undersigned, Dr. B. Chandra Shekhar Reddy, Head, Department of Pharmaceutics, SNVPMV, attended the program and submits this report to the management for kind information and record.

2. Objectives of the Program

The FDP was designed to facilitate a deeper understanding of the revised B. Pharm curriculum (2026) and its effective implementation in alignment with the vision of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The specific objectives were to:



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- Familiarize faculty with the structure and expectations of the revised B. Pharm syllabus (2026).
- Strengthen learner-centric, outcome-based and competency-driven education.
- Promote effective teaching–learning practices, experiential learning and innovative pedagogies.
- Discuss assessment strategies aligned with Outcome-Based Education (OBE).
- Explore the integration of emerging skills such as Artificial Intelligence into pharmacy education.
- Provide a platform for faculty to interact with experts, share academic experiences and clarify curriculum-related perspectives.

3. Inaugural Session

The programme commenced with registration and breakfast, followed by the gathering of participants in the seminar hall. The formal inauguration began with the traditional lamp lighting and prayer song. Dr. Kiranmai Mandava, Principal & Professor and Convener of the FDP, delivered the welcome address and set the context for the day's deliberations.

The inaugural session was graced by the Chief Guest, Shri Jashubhai Hirabhai Chaudari, Vice-President, Pharmacy Council of India, New Delhi, along with several Guests of Honor who addressed the gathering:

- Prof. Chinta Sailu — Pharmacy Dean and Head of the Department, University College of Technology, Osmania University.
- Prof. M. Sunita Reddy — Principal, JNTUH University College of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Sultanpur, Sangareddy.
- Dr. M. Niranjan Babu — Professor & Principal, Seven Hills College of Pharmacy, Tirupati, and Central Council Member, PCI, New Delhi.
- Dr. Veera Reddy Prabhakar Reddy — Head, University College of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Palamuru University, Mahabubnagar, and Central Council Member, PCI, New Delhi.

The dignitaries emphasized the significance of NEP 2020 in reshaping pharmacy education and the collective responsibility of faculty in translating the revised curriculum into meaningful learning experiences. The session concluded with the felicitation of the guests.

4. Technical Sessions

Technical Session I — Overview of the B. Pharm Syllabus as per NEP 2020



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Delivered by Dr. M. Niranjan Babu (Professor & Principal, Seven Hills College of Pharmacy, Tirupati; Central Council Member, PCI) and Dr. Sarat Chandran C (Assistant Professor, College of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Govt. Medical College Kannur, Kerala; Central Council Member, PCI). The session provided a comprehensive overview of the structure of the revised 2026 B. Pharm syllabus, the rationale for the changes, and key considerations for effective implementation at the institutional level. In particular, Dr. Sarat Chandran C presented a detailed, clause-by-clause explanation of the regulations governing the program under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) as per NEP 2020. A summary of these regulations is provided in Section 5 of this report.

Technical Session II — AI Integration into Pharmacy Courses

Delivered by Dr. Damodharan M, Chief Quality & Digital Officer (CQO/CDO), Sai Life Sciences Ltd, Hyderabad. The session focused on the growing role of Artificial Intelligence in pharmaceutical research and education, and how emerging digital tools can be meaningfully incorporated into pharmacy teaching and learning.

Technical Session III — NEP, Outcome-Based Education & Implementation

Delivered by Dr. Sai Balaji Andugulapati, Scientist–E and Associate Professor, Department of Applied Biology, CSIR–Indian Institute of Chemical Technology (CSIR–IICT), Hyderabad. The session elaborated on the principles of Outcome-Based Education under NEP 2020, the framing of course and program outcomes, and practical strategies for implementation and assessment. This was followed by a Q&A session.

Technical Session IV — Quality and Standards in Pharmacy Education

Delivered by Mr. Ashok Eku, Manager, USP Education, USP South Asia, Hyderabad. The session highlighted the role of standards and quality frameworks in strengthening pharmacy education and professional practice.

5. B. Pharm (2026) Regulations — Detailed Explanation (Session by Dr. Sarat Chandran C)

Dr. Sarat Chandran C explained the complete set of regulations of “The Regulation for the B. Pharm. Degree Program — Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) as per NEP 2020” notified by the Pharmacy Council of India. The key provisions, as presented, are summarized below for the department and management's reference.

1. Working Days in Each Semester

- Each semester shall have not less than 90 working days.



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- Odd semesters run from June/July to November/December; even semesters from December/January to May/June, with a break of at least 7 days between semesters.

2. Attendance and Progress

- A minimum of 75% attendance is required in each individual course, with theory and practical attendance counted separately.
- Only candidates who satisfactorily complete the prescribed requirements are eligible to appear for the respective examinations.

3. Program / Course Credit Structure

- Credit is assigned using a multiplier of 1 for each lecture hour and 1/2 for each practical (laboratory) hour per week; every 30 hours of internship or project equals 1 credit.
- A calculated credit value with a fraction of 0.5 or below is rounded down to the lower integer.
- The minimum credit requirement for the award of the B. Pharm. degree is 193 credits, distributed across theory, practical, internship and project over eight semesters.
- Lateral-entry students are awarded 47 credits (41 for the D. Pharm. program and 6 for prescribed additional bridge courses) recorded in the Semester III marks sheet.

4. Program Committee and Internal Examination Committee

- An Internal Examination Committee, chaired by the Principal / Head of Institution, plans and oversees internal assessment, ensures fairness and uniformity, moderates question papers using Bloom's Taxonomy / Miller's Pyramid, and ensures compliance with PCI regulations and NEP-2020 assessment reforms.
- The general scheme for credit-based marks distribution presented in the session is as follows:

Credits	Maximum Marks	Internal Assessment	External Assessment

5. End Semester Examinations

- End Semester Examinations for each theory and practical course (Semesters I to VIII) are conducted by the university.



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6. Promotion and Award of Grades

- A student is declared PASS and eligible for a grade in a course only on securing at least 50% marks in that course, inclusive of internal assessment (e.g., a minimum of 50 out of 100).
- Grace marks and moderation are awarded as per university norms to support learner progression.

7. Carry Forward and Improvement of Internal Assessment

- A student failing to secure 50% reappears only for the end-semester examination of that course, while the internal assessment marks are carried forward.
- A student may improve the sessional component of internal assessment only once, re-conducted within the same semester and without changing the continuous internal assessment.

8. End Semester Supplementary Examinations

- Supplementary examinations must be completed within 2 months of publishing the regular end-semester results (regular exams: Nov/Dec for odd semesters, May/June for even semesters).

9. Academic Progression

- Students may progress to the next semester even if they fail a course; however, all courses up to Semester VII must be completed before appearing for the Semester VIII end-semester examination.
- The final CGPA is awarded only after successful completion of all semesters within the maximum permitted duration.

10. Grading of Performance

- Each student is awarded a final letter grade per course based on performance, as per the grade scheme below:

11. Project Work

- Every student undertakes a project under a teacher's supervision (preferably with an external mentor from industry, hospital, NABL or CDSCO-approved labs, or an allied field), in groups of not more than three, submitting a bound report of at least 25 pages evaluated by internal and external examiners.
- A continuous research theme may be initiated in Semester VII and extended into Semester VIII; the dissertation book carries 60 marks (common to the group) and the presentation 90 marks (individual).

12. Internship

- A minimum of 240 hours of practical training spread over two semesters in a pharmaceutical/cosmetics / medical devices/food industry, hospital, community pharmacy or other relevant field.
- Two internship reports are submitted and evaluated separately (Certificate and report: 75 marks; Presentation and discussion: 25 marks; Total: 100 marks).

13. Industry / Field Visits and Co-curricular Activities

- At least one industrial/field visit per year is compulsory (to API, excipient, formulation, medical device, food or cosmetic manufacturing units, government/NABL-approved testing labs, or NABH-accredited hospitals), with non-repetition of facilities.
- A minimum of 10 valid MoUs must be executed, of which at least 5 must be with pharmaceutical industries.
- Institutions must adopt a village or ward and undertake community service such as prescription surveys, rational-drug-use awareness and patient counseling.

14. Award of Ranks and Degree

- Ranks and medals are awarded on final CGPA; students who fail any course, or who exceed the minimum four-year duration, are not eligible for ranks.
- Candidates fulfilling all requirements are eligible for award of the degree at the ensuing convocation.

15. Duration for Completion and Re-admission after Break of Study



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- The maximum period to complete the program is twice the prescribed duration (N×2); failing this, the student must discontinue.
- Re-admission after a break requires university approval and a condonation fee; condonation is not granted if the break exceeds two years or the program cannot be completed within the maximum permitted duration.

6. Valedictory Session

The program concluded with a feedback session, distribution of participation certificates, closing remarks and a vote of thanks, followed by the National Anthem. Networking opportunities during the breaks allowed faculty from various institutions to exchange academic experiences and best practices.

7. Key Takeaways and Learning Outcomes

- A clearer understanding of the structure, objectives, and implementation roadmap of the revised B. Pharm syllabus (2026).
- A detailed, clause-by-clause grasp of the CBCS regulations — admission, attendance, credit structure (193 credits), assessment scheme, and award of degree — as explained by Dr. Sarat Chandran C.
- Insight into aligning teaching, learning and assessment with the learner-centric and competency-driven vision of NEP 2020.
- Exposure to Outcome-Based Education (OBE) principles and their practical application in framing and assessing course outcomes.
- Awareness of how Artificial Intelligence and emerging digital tools can be integrated into pharmacy curricula and research.
- Understanding of quality standards and frameworks relevant to pharmacy education.
- Valuable networking with PCI Central Council Members, academicians and industry experts.

8. Relevance and Applicability to the Department

The FDP deliberations are directly relevant to the Department of Pharmaceutics and to SNVPMV as a whole, as the institution prepares to implement the revised B. Pharm syllabus (2026). The insights gained on outcome-based curriculum design, modern pedagogies, assessment strategies, and AI integration will be shared with departmental colleagues and applied in course planning, lesson

delivery, and internal assessment to enhance teaching quality and improve student learning outcomes.

9. Conclusion

The One-Day Faculty Development Program was well organized and highly informative. It served as a valuable platform for faculty to understand and prepare for the effective implementation of the B. Pharm syllabus (2026) in line with NEP 2020. The knowledge and perspectives gained will significantly benefit the Department of Pharmaceutics and the institution.
